



Valley nonprofit to host annual ‘Walk With Me’ family fun walk

Walk to benefit services for young children with disabilities on Saturday, May 4

PHOENIX (April 9, 2013) – On Saturday, May 4, Easter Seals Southwest Human Development will host the fifth annual Walk With Me fundraising event at Steele Indian School Park in Phoenix to benefit the nonprofit’s programs and services for children with disabilities.

The 1.25-mile family fun walk is a free event that will feature exciting activities for kids, music, food and drinks, community resource information and more. Event check-in begins at 7:30 a.m. and the walk starts at 8:30 a.m.

“Walk With Me is a great opportunity for people, families and Valley businesses to come together to help create a positive future for children with disabilities,” said Ginger Ward, CEO of Easter Seals Southwest Human Development. “It’s a chance for our community to meet the Easter Seals ambassador families who have been helped by our programs and to support much-needed services for Arizona’s youngest children.”

Nearly 1,200 people participated in the 2012 Walk With Me fundraising event, raising over \$213,000 to benefit Easter Seals Southwest Human Development’s services for children with disabilities.
