Track 1: Reflective Supervision for the Whole Job Feb - Sept 2025

About this Course

This content includes:

- A focus on skills needed for the whole job, and all the roles of a reflective supervisor.
- A focus on diversity, equity and inclusion, and the supervisor's use of critical self-reflection and social location.
- An infusion of the structure and materials from the FAN and RIOS, two well-developed models of structuring reflective practice and supervision.

Who is this course for?

Individuals who have completed introductory training and have experience providing reflective supervision. This training expands on those skills and deepen their supervisory practice.

What does Track 1 training include?

- Eight virtual Learning Blocks consisting of sixteen (16) two-hour sessions scheduled twice a month
- Seven 90-minute small group community of practice sessions
- Approximately 17 hour of asynchronous learning work including reading, viewing video clips and reflective writing
